Dr. Maryann Cusimano Love is a tenured Associate Professor of International Relations in the Politics Department of Catholic University of America, in Washington, DC. She teaches in such areas as Security, Peace Studies, Just Peace, Globalization, and the problem of sovereignty, and has written books on these subjects. She serves on the U.S. Catholic Bishops' International Justice and Peace Committee and engages in Advocacy with the U.S. Government. She is on the Advisory Board of the Catholic Peace building Network and is an ex-officio member of the Board of Jesuit Refugee Services. On March 2, 2017 she will be speaking on nonviolence at an event at the United Nations.

Pope Francis has written the first ever World Day of Peace Message on Nonviolence. This foundational document, *Nonviolence: a Style of Politics for Peace*, urges us to build peace in our personal lives and in our world. Pope Francis reminds us that: "*The politics of nonviolence have to begin in the home and then spread to the entire human family.*" The seminar with Dr. Maryann Cusimano Love will challenge us and inspire us to explore the implications of this message in our daily lives.

The event is co-sponsored by the Department of Social Sciences of the Angelicum University and the JPIC Commission of USG and UISG.

The day will begin with a reflection on non violence as a way to peace. Dr. Cusimano will share her experiences, research and insights, and suggest ways to live out the message of *Nonviolence: a style of Politics for Peace*. There will be an opportunity for questions. The participants will receive a reflective and practical framework to put the message of the World Day of Peace into practice.
